Afghan Picnic Day

For many years past HCCC president Jenny Webb has been involved with people in war-torn and dysfunctional countries. Over the years she has made many contacts and visited countries like Myanmar (Burma) and Afghanistan more than once. Fast forward to more recent years and many people from these countries came to Australia as refugees or as immigrants.

Shepparton was one town where many of the arrivals found their new homes - working their way up until they could purchase orchards, farms or start businesses of their own. Three years ago our Landcare Group, helped by the contacts made by Jenny over the years, invited the Shepparton Afghan Community to Ruffy for an Afghan style BBQ picnic at the Ruffy Recreation Reserve. We were overwhelmed with the response: and the day was such a great success that a return visit was planned for the following year at the Euroa Arboretum.

This year the Afghan Picnic has been set for Saturday, November 8th, again at the Ruffy Recreation Reserve. It will have all the hallmarks of an Afghan Picnic Day, with delicious food and good company, but an invitation has also been issued to the Tablelands Community:

A Soccer Game between the Afghans and the local residents of our tablelands.

(It will be a friendly match but honour could be at stake)

So we need to ask all who think they could participate to let us know, so that we'll know if it's **Game ON!** It should be a lot of fun and we're hoping for young and old to get involved!

We'll also be presenting a fire information session with both the Ruffy and Highlands Brigades bringing the fire trucks on the day, emphasising the importance of fire safety when camping (there will also be a camping display and info session) and the correct approach to responsible camping and 4WDing.

Battery fires prove batteries don't belong in any bin

Murrindindi Shire Council is urging residents to dispose of household batteries safely after two fires have recently occurred at the Alexandra Landfill. The landfill fires, which were caused by the incorrect disposal of batteries, have put the safety of staff, property and the environment at serious risk.

When batteries are mixed in with general rubbish or recycling, they can be compacted in the kerbside collection trucks or at landfill sites, where they may spark against other materials and ignite fires. This is a timely reminder for residents never to place any type of battery in kerbside bins, Resource Recovery Centre waste bays, or landfill.

Instead, batteries can be recycled safely and for free in specially marked battery disposal containers at various locations in your Shire. To make your batteries safe for recycling, cover the terminals with sticky tape before dropping them off at a local RRC or supermarket.

Battery fires can start small but spread quickly, putting both people and facilities at risk. By taking a few extra moments to recycle batteries correctly, you can help keep your community safe.

KPPAC Fox and Feral Cat Control Workshop – Saturday 15th November.

- Poison baiting techniques Canid Pest Ejectors, traditional shelf-stable baits; and the opportunity to access subsidised fox baits as part of a coordinated fox baiting program;

The Pollys to Gooram walk needs no introduction. It is arguably the defining walk in our extensive portfolio, possessing all of the features that make walking in the Strathbogie Ranges special. Meandering ponds, cascading falls, stunning granitic boulders and gorges, steep scrambles and friendly snakes to name just a few.

The walk will start at the Polly McQuinns Weir on Galls Gap Rd, with walkers making their way down the Sevens Creek to Gooram falls (both iconic local swimming spots). From there, a rather lengthy car shuffle will ferry travellers back up the hill to their cars at the weir.

Despite being downhill on average, this is one of the more difficult walks you'll encounter. With steep, slippery scrambles up and down rock faces, boulder hopping, long grass and multiple creek crossings, walkers will be presented multiple challenges to overcome. The rewards are well worth it, but please consider whether this walk is right for you, as there's no phone reception or easy ways out once we get going.

Please note that no pets are allowed on the walks. As always, if the weather is looking hostile on the day, the date may be moved. Numbers will be limited to keep the group size manageable.
