For many years past HCCC president Jenny Webb has been involved with people in war-torn and dysfunctional countries. Over the years she has made many contacts and visited countries like Myanmar (Burma) and Afghanistan more than once. Fast forward to more recent years and many people from these countries came to Australia as refugees or as immigrants.

Shepparton was one town where many of the arrivals found their new homes - working their way up until they could purchase orchards, farms or start businesses of their own. Three years ago our Landcare Group, helped by the contacts made by Jenny over the years, invited the Shepparton Afghan Community to Ruffy for an Afghan style BBQ picnic at the Ruffy Recreation Reserve. We were overwhelmed with the response: and the day was such a great success that a return visit was planned for the following year at the Euroa Arboretum.

This year the Afghan Picnic has been set for Saturday, November 8th, again at the Ruffy Recreation Reserve. It will have all the hallmarks of an Afghan Picnic Day, with delicious food and good company, but an invitation has also been issued to the Tablelands Community:

A Soccer Game between the Afghans and the local residents of our tablelands.

(It will be a friendly match but honour could be at stake)

So we need to ask all who think they could participate to let us know, so that we'll know if it's **Game ON!** It should be a lot of fun and we're hoping for young and old to get involved!

We'll also be presenting a fire information session with both the Ruffy and Highlands Brigades bringing the fire trucks on the day, emphasising the importance of fire safety when camping (there will also be a camping display and info session) and the correct approach to responsible camping and 4WDing.

#### Tallarook – a sport is born

Tallarook was the site for the first rogaine in 1976. This was a cross-country navigation event for teams using map and compass and lasting for 24 hours. Organisation was an alliance between the Surrey Thomas Rovers of Brighton and the newly formed Victorian Rogaining Association.

After 1976, rogaining events became a regular feature on the Victorian Rogaining Association calendar with 200-400 participants at rogaines in most months. Over the next decade the sport spread to every Australian state.

Soon after the 1976 rogaine there was debate whether a special class for veterans over 40 should be introduced with some doubts about the potential interest. Today rogaining caters for teenagers to octogenarians with classes for veterans, super vets, and even ultra vets.

From the late 1990s, rogaining went international with events and participants from over 30 countries. The pinnacle of competition is the World Rogaining Championships with the 20th WRC in South Australia set for 2027.

#### 50th Anniversary Rogaine 2026

From mid-2025 we are in the planning stages of the 2026 Victorian Rogaining Championships with an early preference for holding the rogaine on the Tallarook plateau—recognising the birthplace of the sport 50 years ago. During the feasibility stage we are consulting with the community including landowners; there is no entry to private property without landholder permission, and we are currently seeking that permission.



#### **Book recommendations - Highlands Book Group**

#### Always Home, Always Homesick by Hannah Kent

In Always Home, Always Homesick, Hannah shares the story of her year as a 17-year-old exchange student from Australia living in the small, remote town of Sauðárkrókur in Iceland and then her return visits to research for her eventual bestseller Burial Rites.

#### Lyrebird by Jane Caro

Lyrebirds are brilliant mimics, so if they mimic a woman screaming in terror and begging for her life, they have witnessed a crime. But how does a young, hung over PHD student and a wet behind the ears new detective, convince anyone that a native bird can be a reliable witness to a murder, especially when there is no body and no missing person? And what happens when they turn out to be right?

#### The Lacuna by Barbara Kingsolver

Mexico, 1935. Harrison Shepherd is working in the household of famed muralist Diego Rivera and his wife Frida Kahlo. Sometimes cook, sometimes secretary. Shepherd is always an observer, recording his experiences in diaries and notebooks. When exiled Bolshevik leader Lev Trotsky arrives, Shepherd inadvertently casts in his lot with art and revolution and his aim for an invisible life is thwarted forever.

#### Secondhand Time: The Last of the Soviets by Svetlana Alexeivich

A 2013 book by Belarusian Nobel laureate Svetlana Alexievich. An oral history of the Soviet Union and its end, it shares the feelings and views of its people as the country transitioned to capitalism. The book contains few comments from the author herself.

#### The Gathering by Anne Enright

The Gathering is about the Hegarty family, who gather in Dublin for the wake of their wayward brother, Liam, who drowned himself at sea. Narrated by Veronica Hegarty, the novel explores three generations of the family's history, driven by Veronica's desire to understand the childhood event in her grandmother's house that she believes caused Liam's self-destruction. The story is a lyrical and unsettling exploration of memory, loss, desire, and the dark secrets that bind a family together.

#### **Every Good Boy Deserves Fruit by Dieter Barkhoff**

Every Good Boy Deserves Fruit is a collection of short stories. The first story opens in a schoolyard in North Sunshine. The last story, Mother Tongue, closes as a migrant boy is about to begin his education in the same schoolyard. In between are eleven stories that encompass various phases of the lives of men and women and children and cats and dogs in a place called Victoria, Australia, spanning the years 1956 until the present.

#### Mollie by Rosalie Ham

Molly is an historical novel and a prequel to the bestselling The Dressmaker, published in October 2024. It follows Molly Dunnage as she begins her corsetry business and participates in the suffrage movement in 1914, only to have her dreams challenged by the outbreak of war and an ominous figure in her life, all before she eventually moves to the town of Dungatar.

#### The Bookseller at the End of the World by Ruth Shaw

A rich, immersive, funny and heartbreaking memoir of the charming bookseller who runs three tiny bookshops in the remote village of Manapouri in Fiordland, in the deep south of New Zealand.

#### Kingmaker by Sonia Purnell

An electrifying re-examination of one of the twentieth century's greatest unsung power players - Pamela Churchill Harriman (Winston Churchill's daughter-in-law). Harriman's astonishing life of seduction, intrigue and power, from the bestselling author of A Woman of No Importance. This biography explores behind the scenes WWII strategies and intrigue. Amazing that one "uneducated" woman could accomplish so much.
