#### Welcome, Wumindjika & G'day

This week sees the start of the annual Water Week awareness campaign, with activities to enjoy and to heighten one's knowledge of just how important water is to all living things - not just the human ones.

#### Random WATER facts - Did you know?

- Only 3% of all the water on Earth is fresh water
- Most of that fresh water is locked up in glaciers and ice caps
- Only 1% of all water is potable
- 70% of the world is water
- TGN readers have 2 sources of water supply depending on where they live - reticulated water or rainwater tanks
- Water is a basic Human Right essential to human health, dignity and the realisation of all other human rights
- 2.2 billion people do not have access to safely managed water
- Every day over 1,000 children under 5 die from diseases linked to unsafe water sanitation and hygiene
- Rising sea levels have been found to turn previously fresh water sources salty
- Climate change intensifies the risks and impact of water scarcity
- · Only 1% of all water used in Victoria is for domestic drinking
- BUT every year Australians spend more than \$736 million on bottled water, and almost 375 million of our bottles end up in landfill and waterways, impacting the environment and marine life which is tragic as Australia's tap water is amongst the best in the world
- Plants are about 85-90% water and need water to ensure photosynthesis occurs, for cooling and to transport nutrients and minerals from the soil and into the plant.

The most important resource we have on our precious Blue Planet is not gold, or oil or even Bitcoin but WATER, beautiful life-giving water.

So please treat it with the respect it deserves and appreciate its unique quality to sustain all living things on Earth - including us.



#### **GERMAN INGENUITY**

In Germany, engineers have developed a suitcase-sized micro-hydro unit that taps into the gentle flow of small streams to generate electricity — enough to power around 12 homes. Compact, portable, and quietly efficient, this mini turbine is designed to operate virtually maintenance-free for up to five years. It represents a powerful shift toward hyper-localized, low-impact renewable energy sources that can serve off-grid communities or supplement power in rural areas.

The device works by channeling stream water through a miniature turbine, converting kinetic energy into electricity without the need for dams, large infrastructure, or significant alterations to the waterway. Its unobtrusive design allows it to sit directly in a stream, harnessing natural flow without harming fish or disrupting the ecosystem. One of the most innovative aspects is its plug-and-play nature. The

In Germany, a suitcase-sized micro-hydro unit draws from a small stream to power about 12 homes, running maintenance-free for five years.

unit can be carried in the back of a car, installed in just a few hours, and begins producing power immediately — no construction crew or high-tech expertise required. It's a viable solution for mountainous regions, nature reserves, or remote villages where grid expansion is impractical.

This German innovation reflects a growing trend toward decentralized clean energy systems. Unlike solar or wind, it works 24/7, regardless of weather or daylight. By turning even the smallest streams into clean energy sources, this micro-hydro technology empowers communities to generate their own electricity in harmony with nature.
